Our Pā Harakeke has been gifted varieties that are taonga (treasures) from Ngāti Porou, Ngāti Kahungunu and Ngāti Maniapoto. A part of this establishing the Pā Harakeke is to offer raranga or weaving to tauira and whānau as our harakeke grows and develops.

Following the blessing and formalities we were able to share kai together in the school hall to finish a morning filled with reflection, tikanga and aspiration together.

## Spoken Word










On Saturday the 24<sup>th</sup> of August, our spoken word poets performed at Word the Frontline's Interschool Slam final.





### We need to do some work in your neighbourhood

#### Speed Table Installation and Footpath upgrade

Our role is to ensure that people can move around the city easily and safely. Auckland Transport and its contractor John Fillmore Contracting Limited are set to start work on speed table installation and footpath upgrade in Winstone Road and Denbigh Avenue.

We're constructing a speed table to reduce speed and upgrading the footpath to keep our communities safe. The drawing over the page shows where we'll be working.

We'll do our best to start the work on time. Factors such as wet weather could mean a delayed start. If the delay is significant, we'll notify you.

While the **new footpaths** are being constructed, traffic will be reduced to one lane on Winstone Road and Denbigh Avenue near the intersection. Temporary traffic signals will control two-way traffic flow.

While the **speed table** is being constructed on Winstone Road, there will be no entry from Denbigh Avenue and detours will be in place. Please refer to page 2 with details of the detour routes.

We'll set up signs that give traffic directions for surrounding roads. If you live somewhere along a closed road, traffic controllers at either end of the road will help you. Please follow all signs, light signals and traffic directions.

On-street parking will be limited while we carry out the work. You may need to either park on your property or on a side road and walk to your property.
