Chromebooks

MRGS is an established BYOD school, meaning that your child is recommended to have a device to support their learning in the classroom. The ideal device for learning is lightweight with a keyboard. MRGS teachers use the Google Classroom platform for all their classes as a way of distributing information, assigning classwork and homework tasks, and giving feedback on assessments.

Through our ICT partners New Era, we give our community access to a purchasing portal called Acquire https://newera-byod.acquire.co.nz/. New Era seeks to provide our community with the most competitive pricing for any new device purchases, but if you are struggling to provide a device for learning and you have a community services card, we do have a limited number of Chromebooks available for loan for the 2023 academic year. To access these devices, a \$50 deposit will need to be paid; you or your child will need to present a community services card at the time that you or they make the deposit.

Uniform

As we move into the winter terms of the year, please see below the winter uniforms reminders:

Reminders about uniform

- Hoodies cannot be worn to school, including under school jackets or jumpers
- Beanies are not part of the uniform
- Scarves can be plain black, plain navy blue or the school scarf
- Students can wear a layer under their school shirts, but it must not be visible
- Plain black socks only
- Sandals are not part of our uniform

At the start of this year, we reminded students about our expectations of phone use in lessons. We are currently collating surveys from whānau, students and staff to inform the next steps we take with improving the phone use in our lessons. Our ultimate goal is to improve our Learning Focused Culture in order to provide the best possible learning environment for our students.

Learning Hub Book Review



CLAP WHEN YOU LAND by ELIZABETH ACEVEDO

This book is a verse novel. Wait! Don't stop reading – this doesn't mean poetry or rhymes, a verse novel builds characters and a story just like a novel, but with fewer words and more breaks.

This style of writing actually makes verse novels perfect for young people who find reading difficult or don't enjoy it, because they still deal with gripping and topical themes but with far fewer words.

This story is told by two 16 year old girls. Camino lives in the Dominican Republic with her aunt and Yaharia lives in New York with her mother and father. Neither knows the other one exists.

Camino lives with her aunt because her father lives and works in New York for most of the year, to earn enough money to support them, he only comes home in the summer to spend time with her.

But when a plane travelling from New York to the Dominican Republic crashes and kills everyone on board, the two girls lives change forever.

This beautiful, moving and ultimately uplifting book is available at the school library.

Don't forget these books are also available for free from Auckland Public libraries – all you need to do is register for a (free) library card and you can access a huge collection. If your local branch doesn't have a copy, they will order one for you into the branch. And don't forget they have a huge online catalogue, including newspapers, magazines, ebooks and audiobooks that you can access on your phone. You just need your library card number.




