The other change this year is the inclusion of the new Numeracy and Literacy co-requisites. During Week 5 (27 May - 30 May) students from Years 10 to 13 will be completing these assessments. All students who are involved have been emailed with the details.

Congratulations and thank you to all those who gave blood on Friday 17 May. There were a total of 74 donations made which will make a difference to 222 Kiwi's lives.

We also celebrated Pink Shirt Day on Friday 17 May. In general, Mount Roskill Grammar School is a very welcoming and inclusive environment. Pink Shirt Day this year was a reminder for us all to work hard to keep this.

Our values of Manaakitanga, Tūmanakotanga and Whanaungatanga are strong in our school These values allow us to see the right way of doing things and to call out behaviours that breach these values.

Bullying and harassment are never acceptable in our school and it is all of our responsibility to ensure that we have a safe and inclusive environment.

One group of students who take a leading role in this are our Peer Mediators. Literacy and Numeracy Co-requisite



On Tuesday (28/5), Wednesday (29/5), and Thursday (30/5) of Week 5, senior students who do not have level 1 Numeracy and/or Literacy, including Year 11s who did not pass one or more of the Literacy and Numeracy Co-requisite assessments in Year 10, will have the opportunity to sit the Literacy and Numeracy assessments.

There are three assessments that are offered - Numeracy, Reading, and Writing.
Students will only sit the assessments that are relevant to them. All students who have been entered to sit these assessments have been emailed the venue they will sit the assessment/s in.

Please be advised that we have changed the times and venues of some of the Literacy and Numeracy assessments.

Students need to check their school emails for updates.

Students who have time and venue changes for these assessments were emailed on Thursday May 23 with the new information for these assessments.

Phone use

Blood Day hosted by Rutherford House


We had a very successful Blood Day on Friday 17th of May.

2024 Education Perfect Languages Championships

In Term 2, Mount Roskill Grammar School competed in the 2024 Education Perfect Global Languages Championships. This is part of the Education Perfect World Series.

Over 2,000 schools worldwide competed. **MRGS** came 5th in NZ and 15th in the World. This represented many hours learning languages and revising material in a fun way.

There were a large number of impressive results:

- 75 MRGS pupils gaining awards
- More than 435,000 questions answered by MRGS Languages pupils

The very top students in this competition gained an ELITE Award & Badge because they gained over 10,000 points. They were in the top 0.2% of all competitors.

Annie Ma (1st in MRGS), Candy Qiu, Christina Ah Ken and Catherine Zhao gained an Elite Award & Badge (10,000+ points). Their dedication led to gaining outstanding results worldwide.

Afheid Halim, Yaying Huang, Michelle Naidu, Shreeya Prabhu and Divya Prasad gained an Emerald Award (5,000+ points).

Manha Ahmed, Ben Epream, Jeff Li, Amberlyn Stevenson, Fynauly Tuiutuloa, Leo Zhang and Terry Zhou gained a GOLD Award (3,000+ points).

Other special student & school achievements: **Annie Mao** and **Candy Qiu** were placed 2nd & 3rd worldwide for Chinese.

Fynauly Tuiutuloa and **Divya Prasad** were among the top 10 pupils worldwide in Māori.

MRGS also gained:

5 Silver Awards (2,000+ points), 27 Bronze Awards (1,000+ points) and 26 Credit Awards (500+ points).



Te Kete Rokiroki a Whakaotiranga haerenga ki Te Pane o Mataoho – Mangere Mountain Trip

As an extension of the maara kūmara Project 'Te Kete Rokiroki a Whakaotiranga', a large group of our tauira including tauira teina from MRI and MRPS visited Te Pane o Mataoho/Mangere Mountain Education Centre.

We attend workshops focused on rongoa Māori (traditional medicine), mahi maara (traditional horticulture) including a hīkoi to learn about the history, and the connections of this important place for mana whenua.

On this beautiful day, 55 students spent time up the Maunga where we were taught about the early settlement, food production/storage and pūrākau shared about the origins of the naming of Mangere Mountain.





We learnt about rau kūmara or storage houses which were still evident at the summit.

It was a privilege for our rangatahi and kaiako to learn about mātauranga Māori and we were encouraged to share what we learnt with our whānau and community.

A big mihi to our kaiārahi from Te Pane o Mataoho Te Aorangi and Kimiora for their sharing of knowledge, to Mr Syme who has helped drive this kaupapa and our kaiako for supporting on the day Whaea Lee, Whaea Jackie, Whaea Monique, Whaea Felina and Mr McGibbon.

A huge congratulations to all teams who have competed, and a particular thanks to our coaches, managers and volunteers who are supporting our teams throughout the season.








Student Devices
