Ngā mihi o Matariki, te tau hou Māori.

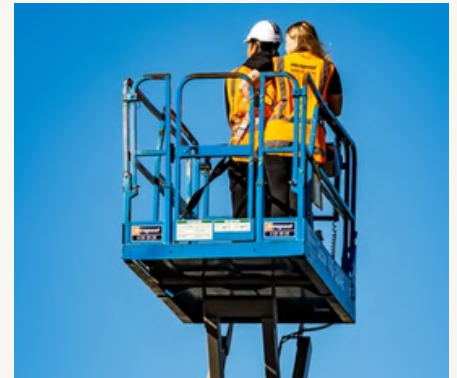

## 2025 Vocational Courses

We are offering two new vocational courses for students in 2025. These courses are designed for students intending to enter the workforce, undertake an apprenticeship or enrol in further training at a Private Training Establishment when they finish school.

### 13TAM - 13 Te Ara Mahi Transition 20 NCEA Level 3 Credits

*What is the course about?*

A transition course that aims to empower Year 13 students to develop the confidence they need to transition from school into the workforce or a Private Training Establishment. Course content will include CV writing, interview & employability skills, teamwork and financial literacy.

### 13NAI- Nailed It Trades Academy. 60 NCEA Level 3 credits

*What is the course about?*

This is a Trades Academy course for Year 13 students interested in a career in a trade such as carpentry, electrical/plumbing, gasfitting and drain laying. Students in this course will spend two days a week at a tertiary provider and three days at MRGS.

# Phone use

## Away for the day

## Attendance

Our current attendance percentage is **81.6%**.

As a school, we are doing a great job of remaining consistent with our attendance which is great.

We reminded students in assembly last week that every minute of learning counts. As a parent, you receive weekly emails about your child’s attendance, as well as being able to view attendance on the Kamar parent portal.

Your child also receives the same email about their attendance. We encouraged students to view this email in assembly last week, and identify opportunities to improve their attendance. Ideally, all students are here at school 90% or more of the time.

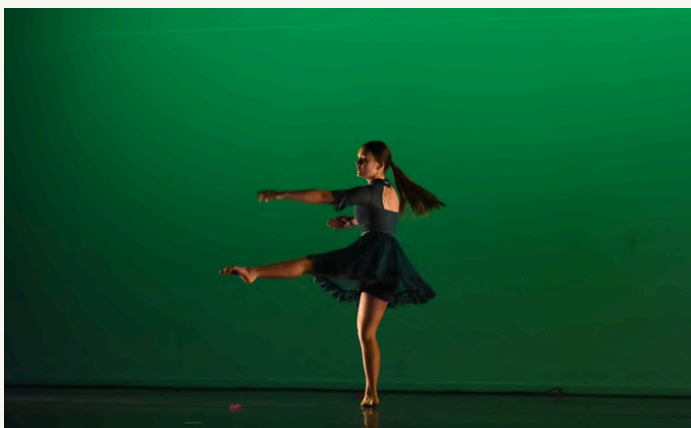
